KENNEL UNION OF SOUTHERN AFRICA REGULATIONS FOR QUALIFYING SHOWS (1989)

SCHEDULE 4A

1. The Executive Committee shall have power and shall be the only authority to grant, withhold or cancel permission to hold any Show and to issue licences therefor in accordance with the Regulations relating thereto.
2. Qualifying Shows may be held by:
 - 2.1 All Breed Clubs
 - 2.2 Group Clubs
 - 2.3 Specialist Clubs
 - 2.4 Clubs being neither All Breeds Clubs, Group Clubs or Specialist Clubs which previously were accorded Championship status, but have lost it.
3.
 - 3.1 Every application for a licence to hold a Qualifying Show shall be made not less than six (6) calendar months before the proposed date, on an official Kennel Union form, signed on behalf of the applicant by the Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary, who shall give their full residential addresses, setting out the information required therein, and such application shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed, a Draft Schedule, and a letter or letters of acceptance from all its judges and a specimen entry form .
 - 3.2 Unless dispensation is granted by the Federal Council, no Qualifying or Re-qualifying Show for any Breed, Group or Discipline shall exceed one (1) day's duration, and no Qualifying Show or Re-qualifying Show shall be held on the same day as a Championship Show, where the same Breed, Group or Discipline are being exhibited, unless the venue is more than 160 kilometres from the venue of the Championship Show.
 - 3.3 No Qualifying Show shall be held at the same venue or on the same date as any Non-Championship Show where the same breeds or groups are being exhibited.
 - 3.3.1 Before applying to hold a Qualifying Show, a New Club must have held two (2) Non-Championship Shows.
 - 3.3.2 No New Club shall be permitted to hold more than one Qualifying Show and one Non-Championship Show in any one calendar year and may only hold a Championship Show in the next calendar year, following that in which it has qualified to hold a Championship Show.
 - 3.3.3 A Club which has lost Championship status in any one calendar year may apply to hold a Re-qualifying Show in the same calendar year.
 - 3.3.4 A Club, which has lost Championship status, shall be permitted to hold a Championship Show in the same calendar year as that in which it has re-qualified to hold a Championship Show.
 - 3.3.5 No Club shall be permitted to hold a Qualifying Show without having obtained a Kennel Union Licence therefor.
4.
 - 4.1 The Show Licence application, signed by the officers of the applicant Club, shall constitute an undertaking given by each of them, binding themselves jointly and severally to hold and conduct the Show under and in accordance with the Regulations of the Kennel Union, to guarantee the payment of all prize monies and to submit to and adopt any decision of the Federal Council, Executive Committee or Provincial or Liaison Council to whom the Federal Council may delegate its powers.
 - 4.2 Such application referred to in Regulation 4 shall also constitute an agreement by such officers and each of them that any decision given against them or any of them under Rule 2 of the Disciplinary Rules (Schedule 1) may be communicated by the Secretary to the Secretaries of all Affiliated Clubs and governing bodies in reciprocity with the Kennel Union and may also be published in the Kennel Union Official Journal, together with a report of the proceedings of the matter, including names, addresses and descriptions.
 - 4.3 Any notice sent by registered post to any of such officers at the addresses given in the application shall be deemed full and sufficient notice to them or any of them of any proceedings, matter, or decisions of the Federal Council or Executive Committee, or relating to the conduct of

the Show, or in respect of any other matter whatsoever arising out of or in connection with such Show.

- 4.4 Notwithstanding and in addition to the provisions of the Disciplinary Rules in Schedule 1, the Executive Committee shall have power to impose a fine upon any Club, the officers or members of which have in the course of conducting a Show breached these Regulations.
 - 4.5 The management of a Qualifying Show shall be the responsibility of the Show Manager who shall be appointed by the committee of the showholding club.
 - 4.6 Every Show shall be deemed to have started two (2) hours before the time judging commences, as advertised on the show schedule. Every Show shall be deemed to have closed one (1) hour after completion of the judging or of the event as the case may be.
5. 5.1 The Executive Committee or any Committee, Provincial or Liaison Council to whom the Federal Council may delegate its powers, shall appoint a person well experienced in the current rules and regulations of the Kennel Union and especially this Schedule, to be styled the Kennel Union Representative, to attend every Qualifying Show whose function shall be to observe that the Show is conducted properly in terms of these Regulations.
 - 5.2 Every Kennel Union Representative who, at the time of his appointment shall be a Kennel Union member of good standing, shall be required to submit a detailed written report to the Kennel Union within seven (7) days of the close of the Show he/she attended in such capacity, reporting on the procedure, conduct and management of such Show, with special reference to observance of Regulations for Qualifying Shows; together with a certificate on the form prescribed indicating as to whether or not the Show holding Club has qualified to hold a Championship Show in the next calendar year.

6. **SHOW SCHEDULES**

- 6.1 The Show-holding Club shall publish a Schedule of the Show which shall contain, inter alia:
 - 6.2.1 the names of the Club's officers;
 - 6.2.2 venue
 - 6.2.3 date of Show
 - 6.2.4 the names of each Registered Competition Assistant
- 6.3 the classification of breeds which may be exhibited, subject to such classification being in accordance with the Regulations set out in Schedule 2 for Classification, Registration and Transfer of Registered Ownership of Dogs;
- 6.4 the names of the Judges of each breed, the groups and variety classes;
- 6.5 the definitions of classes for which competition is offered, subject to all such definitions being in accordance with Appendix 1 of Schedule 3 , (Registrations for Championship Shows);
- 6.6 the amount of entry, benching and other fees;
- 6.7 the trophies, special prizes and prize money offered with conditions of competition therefor, and the names, if any, of guarantors of prizes (see also Regulation 36 of this Schedule);
- 6.8 the conditions under which dogs are eligible to compete for Group Challenges and Best in Show;
- 6.9 the following notices to exhibitors:
 - 6.9.1 puppies under six (6) months are not eligible for exhibition;
 - 6.9.2 a dog is not eligible for entry in variety classes unless also entered and exhibited in a breed class, except a veteran, which may be entered in any Variety Veteran Class;
 - 6.9.3 the mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden;
 - 6.9.4 whether or not bitches in season are admitted for exhibition;
 - 6.9.5 save for dogs entered for Exhibition only, Children's and Junior Handler Classes and Veterans, all exhibits must be entered in at least one (1) Breed Class;
 - 6.9.6 conditions attracting immediate disqualification are set out in Regulation 31 of Schedule 3 (Kennel Union Regulations for Championship Shows (Breed));
- 6.10 All notices of forthcoming Qualifying Shows which are published by affiliated clubs shall contain a statement that all exhibitors/handlers are personally responsible for the control of their dogs at all times and shall be personally liable for any claims which may be made in respect of injuries which may arise or be caused by their dogs. Such notice shall be prominently displayed at the venue on the day of the show in such a manner and in such places so as to ensure that any person entering the venue will see the said notice. Furthermore, all exhibitors/handlers shall sign a declaration in the following form :

DECLARATION BY EXHIBITOR.

I/We have read and understood that

1. If my/our dog has been knowingly exposed to the risk of any infectious/contagious diseases during the period of six (6) weeks prior to showing or, at a show, is found to be suffering

from such; has any reaction to any immunisation or is unfit for showing for any reason, I/we may be dealt with under KUSA Disciplinary Rule 2.

2. In terms of the KUSA Constitution with which I/we agree to abide in all matters concerning this show; also this dog is entered/exhibited at my/our own risk by my/ourself or by my/our agent who has the necessary written permission (attached); it is solely and unconditionally my/our property at the time of exhibition and is registered in my/our name with KUSA or a KUSA recognised organisation.
3. My/Our dog must be kept on a lead or leash, hand held or firmly secured, when not participating, save that it may be slipped off the lead or leash at the discretion of the Judge whilst in the ring or carrying out any licensed event as part of the competition or engaged in practice prior to participating in the show.
4. I/We or my/our authorised agent(s) and/or handler(s) are responsible for my/our dog at all times and may be held personally liable for any claim made in respect of any damage or injury caused by my/our dog.
5. /We furthermore appreciate and recognise that my/our dog/bitch has the ability to cause harm/damage either by attacking or, in some other way, damaging other dogs/bitches, person or property whilst attending the show. Accordingly I/we :
 - 5.1 Personally assume responsibility and liability for any damage caused to any person, animal or property arising out of any action by my/our dog(s)/bitch(es) and any failure to control my/our dog(s)/bitch(es).
 - 5.2 I/We indemnify KUSA and its affiliated clubs under whose auspices the show is conducted, against any claims of whatsoever nature and howsoever arising which may be made against it/them in respect of any action by my/our dog(s)/bitch(es) and/or by my/our failure to control my/our dog(s)/bitch(es).
 - 5.3 We indemnify personally and on behalf of any minor for whom I/we have legal responsibility the organisers of the show and KUSA against any claims of whatsoever nature and howsoever arising which may be made against it/them in respect of any action by such minor at the show.

6.11.1 the time by which dogs are required to be present;

6.11.2 the time judging is to commence and the proposed order of judging (where this differs from the order of breeds listed in Schedule 2 Appendix 'A' and this shall be clearly indicated on the Schedule.

6.11.3 the closing date for acceptance of entries;

6.11.4 a separate entry form which must be in accordance with the approved form, a specimen of which is available from the Secretary.

7. Whenever a Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate classes, amend the prize list, or to return entries, prominent notice thereof shall be displayed in the Schedule and timeous notice of intention to exercise such right shall be given to exhibitors.

8. **Show Schedule:**

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 6 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

9. **Entry for Exhibition:**

9.1 The Shows Committee shall not take gate entries for a Qualifying Show.

9.2 Entries must close at the time indicated in the Schedule which shall not be less than fourteen (14) days and not more than fifty (50) days before the Show opens.

9.3 The Show Secretary shall be held responsible for any violation of Regulation 9.1 and may be dealt with under Disciplinary Rule 2 (Schedule 1).

9.4.1 When an entry form is submitted to a show holding Club, the dog shall be solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitor and at the time of exhibition it shall be registered with the Kennel Union or in a registry formally recognised by the Kennel Union in a written agreement.

9.4.2 No dog shall be accepted for entry in a Qualifying Show where the registration number of the dog is omitted from the appropriate section of the Entry Form. Insertion of the letters "R.A.F." or "T.A.F." is not acceptable and will invalidate the entry.

9.5 In order to constitute a valid entry, the Exhibitor shall complete in ink or typescript, in accordance with the provisions thereon and the Show Schedule, a separate entry form for every dog entered by him, which shall be signed by him or his authorised agent and shall be accompanied by the correct and appropriate fees within the time limitation for closing entries.

9.6 All entry forms shall be preserved by the Shows Committee for twelve (12) months from the last day of the Show.

9.7 No Officer of the Show-holding Club shall complete any entry form except his own, nor shall he

alter or amend any entry form after the entry has been made, nor shall he permit the alteration of or amendment to any entry form after the entry has been made save and except for the correction of bona fide errors by exhibitors in entries for the Minor Puppy, Puppy, Junior and Graduate Classes in respect of age determination where such errors are discovered by the officers of the Show Holding Club after acceptance of the entry.

- 9.8 Any dog which has been exhibited at an unrecognised Show shall, ipso facto be disqualified from entry.
- 9.9 A Show Committee may reserve the right to refuse entry and may exercise such right on good cause and reasonable grounds.
- 9.10 For the purpose of making an entry, in estimating the number of prizes won, wins in Variety, Baby Puppy and Minor Puppy Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, wins at Open Show, Limited Shows and Match Meetings do not count, and wins at Championship Shows awarded after the date of entry do not count.
- 9.11 Within fifteen (15) working days of the closing date of a Show, the Show Secretary shall forward to the Secretary a list showing the total number of dogs entered and the total entries, together with fees as specified in Subscriptions and Fees (Schedule 7).
- 9.12 A KUSA Representative may not enter, exhibit or handle a dog registered in his/her name at any KUSA licensed event held at the same venue on the day that he/she is officiating, nor in the same discipline held under the same licence on any day.
- 9.13 A Judge at a Show may not enter or handle a dog in the same discipline (Breed, Obedience, Working Trials, IPO, Dog Jumping and Agility, Carting), as that in which he/she is officiating. A Judge at a Show may not handle a dog in any discipline on the day/s that he/she is officiating.
- 9.14 No Steward may handle a dog before a Judge for whom he/she was stewarding unless requested by the Judge to exhibit the entry.
- 9.15 Any Exhibitor who enters a dog after disqualification under Regulation 32 is liable to disciplinary action under Disciplinary Rule 2 (Schedule 1).
- 9.16 Any entry form shall be forwarded to the Secretary whenever called for within twelve (12) months from the day of the Show.
- 9.17 Any dog exhibited contrary to these Regulations shall be liable to disqualification and cancellation of any awards gained whether or not an objection has been lodged under Regulation 31.

10. Exhibits only at Show:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 8 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

11. Height and Weight Classes:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 9 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

12. Catalogue:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 10 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

13. Disinfection:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 11 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

14. Licences:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 12 (Schedule 3) shall apply mutatis mutandis.

15. Veterinary Examination:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 13 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

16. Exclusion of Dogs:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 14 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

17. Exhibition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 15 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

18. Exhibition of Dogs:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 16 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows

mutatis mutandis.

19. Use of Sound Amplifiers and Fire Arms:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 17 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

20. Withdrawal from Competition:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 18 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

21. Judging:

The provisions of Championship Show Regulation 19 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

22. Judges:

The provisions of Championship Show Reg. 20 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

23. Challenge Certificates and Reserve Challenge Certificates:

Official Kennel Union Challenge Certificates and Reserve Challenge Certificates, Best Puppy, Best of Breed and Reserve Best of Breed Certificates shall not be awarded at a Qualifying Show.

24. Competition for Groups Winners, Best Puppy in Show and Best in Show

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 24 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

25. Classification:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 25 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

26. Age Restriction:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 26 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

27. Kennel Union Constitution and Show Regulations:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 27 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

28. Public Liability Insurance:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 28 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

29. Prizes:

29.1 whatsoever for any one class, shall be unlimited. Prize money paid out to winners shall be paid at the sole risk of the club concerned. The Kennel Union of Southern Africa is not responsible for any unpaid prize money for any reason whatsoever. Prize money donated by a commercial source or any other sponsor

29.2 All prize money shall be paid to winners free of deduction, save and except for bank commission and charges, poundage on postal orders, and in any case where a prize winner is indebted to the Show-holding Club.

29.3 Whenever an objection has been lodged to a prize winning dog, the prize money shall not be paid out until the objection has been finally determined and the Secretary has notified the Show-holding Club.

29.4 All prizes may be distributed to winners at the Show.

30. Void

31. Objections to Dogs and Disqualification:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 31 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

32. Disqualification and Forfeiture of Prizes:

32.1 If any one of the grounds of objection set forth in Regulation 31.3, Regulations for Championship Shows (Schedule 3) is proved against and in respect of any dog, its entry fees

may be forfeited to the Show holding Club and it may be disqualified from competition and winning any award or prize by:

- 32.2 the Show Committee acting on an objection lodged in terms of Regulation 31, Regulations for Championship Shows (Schedule 3);
- 32.3 the Show Committee acting of its own initiative in terms of Regulation 31, Regulations for Championship Shows (Schedule 3);
- 32.4 the Executive Committee acting in terms of Regulation 31, Regulations for Championship Shows (Schedule 3);
- 32.5 The Executive Committee shall be empowered to publish in the official Kennel Union Journal full details of every dog disqualified, including the name and address of the owner, exhibitor or handler in charge of the dog, and the nature of the objection giving rise to disqualification. The Executive Committee shall have further power to provide full details of every such disqualification to Affiliated Clubs, governing bodies in reciprocity with the Kennel Union and such persons as it shall deem fit.

33. Fine and Penalties:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 33 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

34. Void

35. Ring Numbers:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 35 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

36. Floating Trophies:

- 36.1 The conditions under which Floating Trophies can be competed for shall be inserted in the Schedule of every Qualifying Show in which they are offered for competition and such conditions may not be amended in respect of that Show.
- 36.2 The Committee of every Affiliated Club holding a Qualifying Show shall forward to the Secretary a list of all Floating Trophies owned by the Club, together with the conditions of competition therefor.

37. Fraudulent or Discreditable Conduct:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 37 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

38. Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition:

The provision of Championship Show Regulation 38 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.

39. Obedience Classes, Working Trials and Field Trials:

Obedience Classes, Working Trials and Field Trials or other licensed event may be held at or in conjunction with any Qualifying Show, subject to the conduct thereof being in accordance with Kennel Union Regulations for such class trial or event.

40. Children's Handler Class

The provisions of Championship Show Regulations 8 and 40 (Schedule 3) shall apply to Qualifying Shows mutatis mutandis.
