WHAT IS FLYBALL?

Flyball is the only true team sport offered by KUSA. Flyball sees teams of 4-6 dogs compete in a relay-type event involving jumps and fetching balls. It is fast. It is fun. It is noisy and high adrenaline.



Reasons why you should consider Flyball

- Dogs absolutely love it.
- Great sense of sportsmanship and trust within your team.
 - You build a strong relationship with your dog.
 - It's probably the most fun you can have with your dog!



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How it works...

Flyball is essentially a spectator sport.

The lanes consist of four jumps and a 'box' at the end. Each dog must run over the four hurdles, collect a ball from the box and return over the jumps. As each dog goes through the start/finish poles, the next

dog may commence its run. Teams compete in a round robin format with two teams racing against each other until each team has run against all the other teams. A race is won by the team who is first to have all four dogs complete their run. Speed is important but so is accuracy. Safety is paramount.

You can start training at any stage but generally the sooner the better.

No previous experience is required but it is recommended that you attend socialising and/or puppy classes.

It is essential that dogs have a good recall and are well socialised. Dogs must be physically fit and able to run at high speeds.

Find a team, start training, register your dog, become a member of KUSA, get a Record Card and start competing.

Dogs need to be at least 14-months old to compete.
