

# Meet Our Dog Sport Judges





I have had Border Collies and Rough Collies since 1978. My interest in dogs began early, but I only started with Dog Sports in 1996, with a Border Collie named Jess. Jess & I competed in Obedience, Working Trials, Carting, Dog Jumping and Agility. We did Flyball unofficially, as this was not yet a recognised KUSA discipline. Jess went on to become an Agility, Dog Jumping & Carting Champion, won the SA Agility Championships, came second, and third in 3 consecutive years. Later I acquired some Australian Shepherds, and I added Conformation to our list of disciplines. I competed in multiple disciplines and Conformation with Aussies & Border Collies for a few years, my one Aussie becoming a 5-way Champion and Multi Grand Champion, also Reserve SA Agility Champion one year. We qualified to compete overseas, but unfortunately couldn't go.

I then imported a Border Collie for breeding and working. I began breeding Borders in 2010, after which I imported my first two Shelties. I started breeding Shelties in 2014. My German imported Sheltie excelling in Agility, winning the SA Agility Championships, and becoming a 5-way Champion and multi Grand-Champion. Since then, I have imported many Shelties from all over the world. My kennel, Mackland, is 20 years old and I am proud to have bred many Champions and Grand Champions, and some International Champions in both Dog Sports and Conformation. "Beauty and Brains" is my Kennel slogan ©

I have a Dog Training Instruction Certificate from the University of Pretoria, as well as an Obedience Instruction Certificate from KUSA. I have also passed multiple courses in Clicker Training, and a course in Track Laying and a course in Obedience Stewarding. I qualified as an Agility judge in 2002, and a Dog Jumping Judge in 2003, Flyball in 2009, Carting in 2009, and then as a CGC Evaluator in 2019. I judged the SA Agility Championships in 2016 in Cape Town and the SA Dog Jumping Championships in 2022 in Johannesburg. I am also listed as an International Agility Judge. On the Breed side, in 2022 I was licensed as a Herding judge, and I am currently a Level 2 Junior Showmanship Judge. I serve on numerous Committees, both at Club and Provincial level, and also a Dog Sports Sub-Committee. Career-wise, although I studied Art, Graphics, Photography and Architecture, and worked in Architecture and Engineering, I now have a career in the dog world and shows!

I currently have 10 dogs at home (6 Shelties and 4 Borders), and a few around the country that are co-owned. I currently compete in Conformation, Agility, Dog Jumping, Rally Dog and Trick Dog with 6 dogs, and have 4 retired Veterans over the age of 10. My passion is Agility, and I instruct from Beginners to Advanced in Port Elizabeth, and also give Trick Dog instruction and Clicker Training. I love designing courses, and I love watching top handlers run them. My greatest satisfaction is hearing positive "critiques" of my courses from other judges and handlers. I always try to keep my course designs modern and interesting – it's not easy coming from the "Old school" Dog Jumping & Agility, where courses and course design were \$O different and bizarre!

I am really excited about judging at the KZN KUSA Classic weekend!



My name is Madeleine Fourie but they call me Wallie.

I live in Boston, Bellville in the Western Cape.

I have the great fortune of owning, training and handling Staffordshire Bull Terriers. I currently have Thabisa and Thembani – Thabisa is my little angel, still very young and active, but Thembani is retired and only participates in Carting these days. I love going on walks with them and Thabisa loves the water – whether it be the beach or a dam. She also loves to interact with other dogs.

Currently, I am qualified to judge Carting, since 2016, and Dog Jumping, since 2018, at Championship Show level.



I became involved in Agility in 2005, when I got my first Border Collie. I started attending Obedience classes and was told by a fellow handler that I should try Agility. "What? At my age!" said I – well here I am almost nineteen years later enjoying my Agility journey and yes that handler has become a very dear friend. It didn't take long and I was asked to join the KZNDAA Committee as Secretary. I then became the Chairlady. After a break of some two/three years, in 2016, I stepped up to help out as the majority of the then KZNDAA Committee resigned abruptly which caused the Club to be in breach of KUSA regulations. I hold this position to date. I also became involved in the Natal Border Collie Committee and have held the position of Secretary for the Club for a number of years.

I, of course, didn't leave it at being on the KZNDAA Committee. I also became an Agility Judge. Judging gives a whole new perspective to Agility and I enjoy watching the dogs and seeing the enjoyment they get by doing things dogs don't usually do, just to please their handlers. I have also extended my judging journey to Flyball. I have still to complete my practical and look forward to judging another discipline.

My daughter, Deanna Hewer and her three daughters, Jacqueline, Jamie-Lee and Kenzie also got involved in Agility. Deanna has no desire to jump a dog but became involved on the administrative side and attends Shows to support her daughters and, of course, her Mom. Deanna and I became representatives for two Clubs on the KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Council and are now further involved, Deanna being the Provincial Secretary and me being the Treasurer of the KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Council. I now also represent KwaZulu-Natal at the Executive Committee meetings held monthly.

I have competed with four dogs since starting my Agility journey and my now nine year old Shetland Sheepdog, Ditto, made me very proud becoming a Dog Jumping Champion in 2022. I recently got another dog to compete with and I also did a count of the number of dogs my granddaughters and I have had over the years with which we competed. The number is 18! We, of course, are not blessed to have them all still with us but will be forever grateful for the joy they brought to our lives.

I will continue to be involved in Agility for as long as I am able to and am very grateful to have those, who Agility brought into my life, as part of my daily life and who have become not only friends but dear friends and for opening their hearts to not only me but my daughter and my granddaughters.



I started exploring the world of Agility in 2016, shortly after I got my Border Collie puppy, named Aramis. During this time, I spent more time on Aramis's development, and we started with Agility training early 2019, when Aramis was just over 2 years old. This is when my wife and I saw that Agility was like a missing puzzle piece that just fitted right in. As Aramis gained confidence and a passion for the Sport, so did I, and I wanted to become more involved in the Sport. I enrolled for the next KUSA Agility Judge's Course, which was held at the end of 2021. The following year, 2022, I enrolled in an International course building and judge's course, called "OfCourse", hosted by Petr Pupik, Jan Egil Eide and Tamas Traj. Between the KUSA Judge's course and the International course, I have learnt a great deal about building and judging safe courses, that are entertaining as well as testing Grade appropriate challenges.

Although I have learnt so much, I continuously consult with senior KUSA judges to guide me and to further my knowledge and gain experience, and I will continue to learn and broaden my experience base. I officially qualified as a KUSA Agility Judge in December of 2022, and I have also qualified as a SADAA Agility Judge in August of 2023. From that time, I have judged multiple Championship and Open Shows, including an out-of-province KUSA Show in April 2023, and also two full Shows in East London running over a weekend.

In September of 2023, I successfully designed and judged a NAL (National Agility League) course. I have signed contracts and am committed to judge four SA Championship Trials in East London and two Trials in Gauteng in 2024.

I have developed a love for Agility, both as an exhibitor participating and as a judge in an official capacity. I aspire to keep my course designs fun and challenging and my standards to the highest degree, exceeding expectations.

Looking forward to judging over the KUSA Classic Weekend 2024 in KZN and to spending great days with like-minded people. KZN here we come!



How my log-sports-in-action started...

My Mom got a Border Collie in 2005 and attended training with her Border Collie at Natal Border Collie Training Club. She was approached by a handler who told my Mom to attend Agility training, which my Mom attended in 2007. I then became involved with Dog Sports as my Mom attended the Shows. I was then approached in 2009 to join the Sub-Committee in KZN to help with organising and hosting of the first SOUTH AFRICAN AGILITY CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS. I served on this Sub-Committee until 2018.

I started my journey as an Agility Learner Judge in 2013 and qualified as a Championship Show Agility judge in the same year. I have subsequently qualified as a Flyball judge at Championship Show level.

I have not ever run a dog in Agility myself but over the years I have learnt the different techniques needed to design and set up courses that are safe for dogs of all sizes to run and have fun.

Currently, I serve on three Club Committees and to date I hold the portfolios of Chairlady, Secretary and Treasurer. I also serve on the KZN Provincial Council Executive Committee in the position of Secretary and have served in this capacity for the last four years. I am also part of the KUSA Classic Organising Committee KZN 2024.

I am extremely excited to welcome all competitors to KZN for the KUSA Classic Weekend 2024, which promises to be an amazing weekend, filled with healthy competition, good sportsmanship, great camaraderie and fantastic company.



My name is Louise Thompson

I'm judging Carting at the KUSA Winners Show on Sunday, 2nd June 2024, as part of the KUSA Classic Dog Sport Weekend in KZN.

My 1st Carting dog was a Giant Schnauzer, Heinie, in 1999, and we travelled to Bloemfontein, KZ, and many local shows. He became a Carting Champion at the Bloemfontein Shows in 2009 and sadly died 2 months later. I also started to enter Breed Shows in 2007, with Lily, a Miniature Schnauzer and started Carting with her as soon as she became a Breed Champion. She became a Carting Champion, Runner-Up for Carting Nationals in 2011, 3rd for Carting Nationals 2013, won Best of the Best in 2010. I then rescued another Miniature Schnauzer, Remi, who became a Carting Champion, 2nd at Carting Nationals in 2016, won the Inter Provincial (Gauteng Team) in 2017 and 3rd at Carting Nationals in 2017.

Callan, also a Miniature Schnauzer and Breed Champion, was my next Carting dog. He won Carting Nationals in 2022, at the age of 10 years old. He is now retired. Currently, I have a 10-month old Miniature Schnauzer pup, Troy, who will be entered in Rally and Carting in a few months time when he 14 months old. I have also handled numerous other dogs in Carting - a Beagle, Poodle and am busy training a Smooth Collie - and I do Tracking, Obedience and Rally with my other dogs.

I'm a qualified judge for Carting (2018) and Rally Dog (2023) and an aspiring Obedience Judge (Beginners, Novice).



I started my first obedience training at the age of 16 with my first dog, Oscar, at the Natal German Shepherd Dog Training Club. We achieved some awards and got to Novice Class when he was tragically run over. In those days there were no fences and the dogs roamed freely in the neighbourhood. My second dog, as always happens, was a registered Border Collie, Flash, and we started training at the Port Natal Dog Training Club and the Umbogintwini Club and managed to achieve a qualification in A Class. Unfortunately, he had a bad temperament and we had to stop attending, especially if there were men involved. I started stewarding around the end of 1989 and then my first judging appointment was at the Pietermaritzburg Kennel Club Show in the June of 1990. During 1990 I bought a registered Golden Retriever and we trained with Liz Lyon and managed to get to B Class. I did enter Breed once, but I must admit, I far preferred competing in Obedience.

I am currently a B Class judge, having judged at many Shows over the years, including Gauteng. I am also a CGC Evaluator.

During my early days I was a trainer at the Port Natal Dog Training Club as well as the Umbogintwini Dog Training Club. I have belonged to the Umbogintwini Dog Training Club, Border Collie Club, Natal Gundog Club, Dobermann Club of Natal and Port Natal Dog Training Club and currently a member of The Golden Retriever Club of KZN. I have served on many Committees over the years as well as the Obedience Sub-Committee which then became the Working Disciplines Sub-Committee and now back to the Obedience Sub-Committee, The Natal Gundog Club, Border Collie Club, Dobermann Club, The Golden Retriever Club and the Top Achievers Committee. I have also been part of Committees that have brought trainers from other countries, who have passed on their knowledge to us, such as Patricia Holden-White, who was instrumental in introducing CGC to South Africa and Christine Zinc.

By profession, I am a Pre-School teacher and Lecture on a part-time basis for an NGO called the Caversham Educational Institute, where we uplift and train teachers from previously disadvantaged backgrounds.



I have been involved in dogs for almost four decades and started breeding Great Danes under the "Tretower" affix in 1988 with considerable success, and my husband, Edward, and I ran Great Dane Rescue in Kwa Zulu-Natal for 17 years. I am currently an Honorary Life Member and President of the South African Great Dane Association.

I have competed in Classic Obedience, Carting and Rally Dog with my Great Danes, most of which have successfully passed Canine Good Citizen, with some of them achieving Gold level, and am currently competing in Obedience, Rally Dog, CD, BH/VT and Trick Dog with my Belgian Shepherd Dog (Groenendael).

I have judged Breed - under dispensation many years ago - and have ring stewarded for many of the other Dog Sport disciplines. I am a licensed Aptitude Test & Rally Dog Judge and also a Canine Good Citizen Evaluator. I currently serve as Secretary of the Rally Dog Sub-Committee on the KZN Provincial Council.

I have run Tretower Dog Training School for the last 13 years, focusing on competitive Obedience, Canine Good Citizen, Rally Dog and early Canine Development.

I look forward to judging at the KZN KUSA Classic weekend and to meeting all the exhibitors from near and far!



I qualified as an Obedience C Class judge in November 2019. Since I qualified, I have judged C Class on 34 different occasions, having done so mainly in KwaZulu-Natal. In October 2023, I was invited to judge at three Shows in Cape Town, one of which was C Class. Since 2009 to present I have judged 125 other Obedience Classes. I began judging in 2004, having served an apprenticeship as a ring contestant and as a steward.

I have been part of the official dog world since 1990 when I joined the Natal German Shepherd Dog Club to train my Labrador Retriever. I then progressed to entering Obedience competitions and also for a time dabbled in Agility and Field Trials. In 1995 I was appointed as a trainer at the Natal German Shepherd Dog Club and served for several years as the Director of Training. I still serve the Club as an Obedience trainer. In 1995 I was also elected to the Club's Management Committee. I currently serve on the Club's Executive Committee as the Treasurer.

Currently, I am the Chairman of the KwaZulu-Natal Obedience Sub-Committee and consequently serve on the KwaZulu -Natal Provincial Council.

In addition to being an Obedience judge, I am also a Canine Good Citizen Evaluator and as a result, my involvement in the dog world is extensive.



I started my dog training career way back in 1997 when I joined Birch Acres Dog Training Club with my Staffordshire Bull Terrier, Clyde. We competed in the Obedience ring for a few years. However, my passion for Flyball was still to come when I was introduced to it with my Australian Shepherd, Chewbacca in 2009.

We achieved a few first awards:

- First "ABC" dog to become KUSA ChampionFirst "ABC" dog to become KUSA Grand Champion
- First dog to reach 4500 Flyball points.

My next big achievement, along my Flyball journey, was being part of the winning team at the 2019 KUSA Flyball Nationals with my Border Collie, Frankie.

I qualified as a Flyball Championship Show judge in February 2019 and have judged numerous events over the years. I received my first Nationals judging appointment last year in Cape Town and am honored to judge this event again in KwaZulu-Natal in 2024.



I started training dogs in 1991 with my first Border Collie, Numbi, at Birch Acres Dog Training Club and have since trained numerous dogs in various disciplines. I competed with my German Shepherd, Zenka, at the old Rand Easter Show Dog Jumping event in 1998, where we came 8th overall.

My passion for Flyball started in 2006, after seeing it live at Crufts, and I have competed since 2007. I have been a judge since 2009. I am the Flyball trainer at Birch Acres Dog Training Club, the NAPC Flyball Sub-Committee Chairman, KUSA National Convenor for Flyball as well as the KUSA Representative on the FCI Flyball Commission.

I have owned 4 Flyball Champions over the years – Kenu (2008), Moya (2013), Xani (2014) and Quade (2019) and hold 3 Nationals Flyball Team titles with Xani and one with Quade. Had it not been for Covid, I would have travelled to Belgium in 2020 with our Flyball Team to compete at the Flyball Open World Cup. Sadly that never materialised.

I love judging Flyball as much as running it and competing and it is always an honour to judge any competition, especially Out-of-Province. It is fantastic to see the Sport grow year-on-year in all the Provinces and how the times are improving as well.



My name is Selvin Lewis

I live in Cape Town, Western Cape and I have competed in Obedience with my Rottweilers and currently with my BSD Malinois. Many of my dogs have succeeded in becoming Obedience Champions.

I am an Obedience Judge, qualified to judge all Obedience classes up to C Class at Championship Show level. I have been involved in APT as a Test Leader for many years as well as a Protection Work Helper in Federation and KUSA as a decoy bite work.

I am also a KUSA CGC Evaluator, licenced to evaluate Puppy, Bronze, Silver and Gold levels and served as Chairman of the Cape Rottweiler Club some years ago.

At the moment, I am actively competing in IGP Shows with my Malinois and Shepherds.



Brian William Blades

I obtained my first Dobermann in 1977, it took about a year before I realised I needed help as we were the owners of one totally out of control Dobermann. Once we started training she became a different dog. We both did well and progressed very quickly. We entered our first competition about a year later and came first, the bug had bitten and I eventually made her into an Obedience Champion. I was on my way to a long and successful obedience career.

I started my Obedience judging career in 1982 and in 2006 was awarded the status of Senior Obedience Judge by the Kennel Union of Southern Africa. For many years I was Chairman of the Dobermann Club of Natal and the Director of Training and currently assist in training a number of handlers for competition Obedience.

To date I have trained two Dobermanns to Obedience Champions, two Dog Jumping Champions (Blake became the first ever Dog Jumping Champion in South Africa), one dog to IPO II Ex. and 3 dogs to CD Ex. as well as numerous dogs qualifying APT.

In 1985 my wife and I started 'Chevindale Kennels' breeding Dobermanns very successfully producing many Breed Champions. Our most successful being Champion Chevindale Ozymandus who was Supreme Dobermann for four years running and Champion Chevindale Majestic ZTPV1A, IPO II ex, APT ex.

I am a Dobermann Specialist Breed Judge, a Championship Working & Herding Group Judge as well as a Championship Child & Junior Handler judge.

At home we have two Dobermanns, two Schnauzers and a horse.



My name is Barbara Egan

I live on the South Coast of KwaZulu-Natal and I have participated in Dog Jumping and Agility for many years and was very successful in these 2 Dog Sport disciplines with my Border Collies.

I qualified as an Agility judge in 2008 and I have judged four SA Championship Shows, and one Championship event in Namibia. I further qualified as a Dog Jumping judge in 2011. I have competed, with reasonable success, in both disciplines with multiple dogs since 2005.

I developed an interest in Carting and started competing in 2015 and won KUSA Nationals with my Dobermann in 2016, Southernbelle Hash. I subsequently qualified as a Carting judge in 2017.



I have been judging Agility since 2017 in both Gauteng and KZN. I started doing Agility with my dogs when I lived in Johannesburg and Pretoria. Now I live on the KZN South Coast with my husband and five Border Collies. We now compete in a very supportive KZN Agility environment. I began Agility with Tiggy, my first Border Collie, at Jolly Dog School and was taken in by his jumping happiness. I then sort of fumbled my way into shows and was so proud to finally get Tiggy into Grade 3.

Meanwhile, I began to train Shade and Bruno at KAD (Kyalami Academy for Dogs) under Noelene Pretorius. When we moved to KZN, we joined Canine Active where we still train under Taryn Murphy. Shade is now a Dog Jumping, Agility and Non-Contact Champion and was KZN Top Achiever in Agility in 2022 and KZN Top Achiever in Dog Jumping in 2022 and 2023. Bruno is an Agility and Dog Jumping Champion and was KZN Top Achiever in Agility in 2023. Shade qualified for SA Agility Champs in 2020 and 2022 and Bruno qualified in 2023.

I have a new Agility partner, a nearly three-year-old Border Collie, Wit, who is now in Grade 2 Agility and Non-Contact.

I try to design open courses, using all the space of the arena. I attempt to test a range of skills on a course and place obstacles so that handlers have handling options. I enjoy judging because it gives me the opportunity to see how other handlers get their dogs to execute a course. I particularly enjoy experiencing secondhand, a handler's joy in doing well, no matter how small the achievement. For a Grade 1 handler, it might be the thrill of getting around a course whereas a Grade 3 handler might be excited by executing a technical manoeuvre that she's been working on. It's not easy to judge but it has its rewards.

Another reason for becoming a judge is to give back to the Sport. I am also a learner Flyball judge and four of our dogs take part in Flyball. In addition, I serve on the KZNDAS Committee as Secretary.

I'm looking forward to judging at the KUSA Nationals weekend and hope that my courses are challenging but manageable for all participants.



I grew up in an animal loving family and some of my earliest memories were of shows at Goldfields where my parents exhibited Pyrenean Mountain Dogs, which they also successfully bred. At the age of 14 I had dreams of competing with my dog in Agility and had jumps set up all around the garden.

After many years living in rural Zululand and Game Reserves, I moved back to Durban and got my first Sport dog, an Australian Cattle Dog, in 2009. Training her taught me more than I bargained for, and we competed successfully in Obedience, Non-Contact Agility and Dog Jumping. I now own and exhibit another Australian Cattle Dog, which I have made up to a Breed Champion and am training her for Agility, Dog Jumping and Rally Dog.

When Rally Obedience, as it was called then, was introduced to KZN, I leapt at the opportunity to try something new and loved it. To assist in getting Rally recognised as an official Dog Sport in South Africa, I entered as many classes as I could! When we heard that it was going to become recognised as an official Dog Sport, I signed up to be part of the team to establish it in KZN. I became a Rally judge in 2021 and currently sit on the KZN Rally Sub-Committee.

I am the Chairperson of the Bluff Dog Club, where I have also previously held the portfolio of Director of Training. I am also one of the trainers at the Bluff Dog Club, assisting with foundation training as well as Advanced Obedience, Rally, basic Dog Jumping and Trick training.



My Agility Story

I started my Agility Career about 10 years ago, just as an agility-husband on the sidelines, supporting my wife at Shows. I fell in love with the Sport and with the Agility family right away and knew that we were part of something special. Just being on the sidelines for the first few years, slowly evolved into scribing and being involved on Committees etc. Then I got convinced to do the Judges course and before I knew it, the judging journey began.

I qualified as an Agility Judge in 2018 and a Dog Jumping Judge in 2020 and it has been an amazing journey since. In the beginning, not being a handler, it was actually quite difficult to design courses and get lines and things like that right but as time went on I started finding that my courses were flowed better, became more challenging when needed and the lines more suitable for the various Grades.

The next big progression in my Agility career was when I started running my friend's Border Collie, Rango!!! From not being a handler to suddenly being a handler and running lines, dealing with off obstacles, challenges etc., was actually really exciting. Rango and I have had some magic moments but one of the best things, I think my journey with him has taught me, is to actually become a better judge, a better course designer.

Being a handler opened up a whole new perspective on my course designs and I am grateful for that aspect of my journey. One of my favourite things as a judge, is once I have built my course and got the lines etc right, and you get to see the course on the ground and the challenges that there are, is to watch the handlers and their dogs running the course. I love it when someone goes clear or even just gets something right they have been working on and although I am out there judging, I want them to succeed. I get excited for their success and that is my reward for being a judge.

This year I will be judging at the KUSA Bumper weekend in the Eastern Cape as well as the Bumper weekend in Gauteng. Also KUSA Nationals DJ rounds but I think the highlight for me is to have been selected to judge the South Africa Agility Championships and the AWC rounds this year.

Exciting journey ahead and I look forward to seeing everyone out there doing what they and their dogs love doing. At the end of the day that is what it is all about <sup>(3)</sup>

I live in Gillitts, Durban and my hobbies include mountain and road cycling, dog training, Helicopter Flying PPL Registered Pilot R22 & R44

I have been involved with dogs and dog training since the 1980's. I have trained my favourite 2 Breeds, viz. Border Collie and German Shepherd. During this time I trained two dogs (Woeffels and Lady) for narcotics and explosives detection, involved with searches at Airports and Embassies. In the 1990s I was involved with 2 of the largest Clubs in the Western Cape, viz. Cape Province Dog Club and Cape Handlers Club, both as a Committee member and trainer, where I was involved in Agility and Obedience training and various demos for the Sport.

In 2010 involvement in the KUSA Dog Sport began. I became a Learner Judge for Working Trials and judged my first WT Show. In the same year. I also became a CGC Evaluator and assessed my first CGC. I continued on my judging journey becoming a Learner Judge in Obedience and more recently qualifying as a Rally Dog Judge in 2022 after competing in Rally. I attended a Dog Jumping Judges and Agility Judges programme in 2017 and 2022 respectively.

I become an Assessor (2010) and Moderator (2019) with the Department of Higher Education in Dog Subjects – certified to teach over 67 subjects relating to dog training. I was National Chairperson for Pets as Therapy in 2010. I became a Canine Hoopers World International Instructor/Assessor and brought Canine Hoopers World to Southern Africa. I have studied at various Institutions around the world, including Puppies and puppy development at the University of Pretoria and an Animal Behaviour Course at the College of Ethology in 2015. Animal Welfare and Care at the University of Edinburgh and The Royal Dick School of Veterinary Studies – Jeanine Marchig International Centre for Animal Education. In 2020 EDIVET at the University of Edinburgh, Dog Emotion and Cognition at University Leeds as well as Canine Kinesiology with Specialised Kinesiology College of Southern Africa and the International College of Professional Kinesiology Australia. I have also studied Zoo Pharmaoclogy at The Complementary Medical Association (The CMA) and am currently studying Animal Behaviour in conservation at Wageningen University.

In 2009 I started my business, The Smart Dog K9 Behaviour and Training Academy in Cape Town which I relocated to Durban in 2011. In 2019 I started Smart Service Dog, training dogs to be used by people with various disabilities, at present 1 of only 2 companies in Southern Africa to be accredited by the Association of Assistance Dogs Southern Africa. I have also operated several Puppy Schools through the Hills and Eukanuba Puppy Programmes. Following the Covid pandemic, I launched my Online Canine Learning Academy, educating handlers via an electronic means in dog training and dog First Aid.

To attain the "Int. Agility Champion" (C.I.AG.) (S-M-I-L) title the following requirements need to be met:

- Dog must be registered with a Stud Book recognised by the FCI
- Must have earned two (2) FCI-C.A.C.I.A.G® awards in two different countries under 2 different judges over a minimum period of one year and one day.
- Must have been awarded a grading of "Good" or better in a Show sanctioned by the FCI.
- Every Country will propose to the FCI its candidates for the title of International Agility Champion and will provide the relevant documents.

#### Please take note of the following:

- Only dogs with a KUSA Registration Number are eligible to enter Shows and those dogs which have been given showing
  dispensation by the KUSA Office for these Shows.
- Only Members of the Kennel Union shall be entitled to enter dogs in their registered ownership in any Championship Dog Show licensed by the Kennel Union.
- Exhibitor numbers can be collected from the Show Office.
- The mating or whelping of bitches within the precincts of the Show venue is forbidden.
- Bitches in season may only be exhibited in Agility and Dog Jumping at all events and exhibitors must exercise due
  consideration towards other exhibits.
- No animal other than an exhibit entered for competition or exhibition shall be allowed on the grounds, with the exception of registered guide dogs.
- No late entries will be accepted.
- No refunds of entry fees will be made for any errors whatsoever made by the owner/exhibitor/authorised agent.
- All owners/exhibitors/authorised agents/handlers are advised that they and any exhibit entered in any event over the KUSA
  Classic Weekend may be photographed for, by, or on behalf of KUSA for the use and possible publication of such
  photograph by KUSA. A special area for the taking of photographs will be provided.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to appoint alternative Judges; re-allocate Classes and advise all exhibits entered; or adjust the judging times prior to the Show, should the appointed Judges be unable to officiate, or receive too large or too small an entry.
- The KUSA website, KUSA Classic 2024 Facebook Page and KUSA Classic 2024 WhatsApp Group are the only communication media officially recognised by the Show Committee.

#### The FCI Show is held under the Rules of the FCI, which include the following:

- o The dogs' welfare must be of utmost priority at all dog Shows. It is forbidden to expose a dog to a situation that can be dangerous for its health and welfare, such as leaving it in the car in excessively hot or cold weather and/or treating it in a cruel manner. Violation of this rule will result in exclusion from the present and future dog Shows.
- o The FCI Show is judged according to FCI Regulations.
- o Late entries (after the closing date) are not permitted.
- o No transfer by an exhibitor of a dog from one Class to another is permitted after the closing date.
- o If a dog behaves aggressively in the ring and its behaviour is eye-witnessed by the Judge on duty, the latter must submit a report for the attention of the Organising Committee and must disqualify the dog for the rest of the competition. All the awards and titles of the day are consequently cancelled.
- Where FCI regulations are not covered, then KUSA Schedule 3 shall take effect.
- All the other Shows will be held according to the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Union of Southern Africa.
- Please keep the grounds and bathrooms clean.
- When exercising your dogs, please clean up after them. Do not leave it for others or the ring stewards to do.

ALL EXHIBITORS/HANDLERS ARE PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CONTROL OF THEIR DOGS AT ALL TIMES AND SHALL BE PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL CLAIMS IN RESPECT OF INJURIES WHICH MAY BE CAUSED BY THEIR DOGS.

#### **RIGHT OF ADMISSION RESERVED**
