This document is prepared on the basis that the LRKC's 68th Annual General Meeting is to be conducted Online, through Microsoft Teams and assist attendees on the process that will be followed during the meeting.

1. Prior to the date of the LRKC AGM, all confirmed attendees will be sent an electronic meeting invite by e-mail with a link to join the meeting. In this invite, the AGM meeting pack will also be emailed electronically, and set on the screen display to follow the meeting for ease of reference.
 - a. You do not need to have Microsoft Teams installed on your PC to join the meeting. Follow the instructions below to join the meeting.
 - b. In the email invite, select Click here to join the meeting.
 - i. You can also use a dial-in number and conference ID from the email to call in.
 - c. Three choices will present itself:
 - i. Download the Windows App.
 - ii. Continue on this browser: Join a Teams meeting on the web.
 - iii. Open your Teams app.
 - d. Select option two if you do not have the Microsoft Teams App.
 - e. Type your name, so that we can identify who you are for attendance and voting purposes.
 - f. Choose your audio and video settings.
 - i. Upon entering the meeting, everyone is required to mute their microphone so that the necessary business may be conducted.
 - ii. You are more than welcome to have your video display on, remember that this does slow down your internet.
 - g. Select the Join Now option.
 - h. Everyone will then go to the lobby, and thereafter admitted into the meeting.
2. Remember, your microphone is to be muted, if your microphone is not muted, it will be muted on your behalf.

5. Apologies will then be noted.
 - a. Should you wish to note an apology, please raise your hand, wait to be given the opportunity by the chairman, then unmute and re-mute accordingly.

 - a. Voting will take place by means of raised hands, which will need to be recorded accordingly. Please allow the Chairman and Secretary to record these, and only once recorded please remove the “raise hand” option.

ADDENDUM 1: NOMINATIONS FOR LRKC MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

EXTRACT FROM THE CLUB'S CONSTITUTION

16. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- 16.1. The management and control of the Club shall be vested in a Committee consisting of no fewer than five (5) and no more than ten (10) Members. All Committee members must be Members and not less than eighteen (18) years of age at the time of their election at an Annual General Meeting, to hold office as hereinafter provided.
- 16.2. At its first meeting, which shall be held within seven (7) days of the Annual General Meeting at which it was elected, the Committee shall
- 16.2.1. from among its number, elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman who must both be Members in Good Standing of KUSA and remain so for their full term of office. Should their KUSA membership lapse during their terms of office, they shall forfeit the position of Chairman or Vice-Chairman, as the case may be, but shall be entitled to remain on the Committee as an Ordinary Member;
- 16.2.2. from among its number, appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer who must both be Members in Good Standing of KUSA and remain so for their full term of office. Should their KUSA membership lapse during their terms of office, they shall forfeit the position of Secretary or Treasurer, as the case may be, but shall be entitled to remain on the Committee as an Ordinary Member; and
- 16.2.3. appoint all other Committee members to portfolios as may be determined by the Committee.
- #### 16.3. Terms of Office
- 16.3.1. The Committee elected at its first Annual General Meeting held under this Constitution shall, at its first Committee Meeting, also determine by lot which Members, being one-half of the total membership of the Committee, shall retire from office at the end of the next Annual General Meeting. Except for the Committee members thus chosen to serve for one (1) year only, all Committee members shall be elected to serve for a term of two (2) years. All Committee members, upon conclusion of their term of office, may offer themselves for re-election, provided they remain eligible otherwise.
- 16.3.2. The offices of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer shall be held from the date of appointment thereto until the close of the next Annual General Meeting.

As announced in the Chairman's annual report, a floating trophy, the Ch Balrion Lord of the Manor of Breckondale Trophy, will be awarded each year, starting in 1990, to the owner (or owners) winning the highest aggregate of points with any number of dogs at the LRKC's championship show and two open shows in any one year."

POINTS SYSTEMS FOR AWARDS NOT PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The points systems for the Craignair Breeders Field Trial Trophy and the Craignair Breeders Show Trophy are included below for information purposes only. These trophies are awarded annually at the LRKC Field Trial and the LRKC Championship Show, respectively.

CRAIGNAIR BREEDERS SHOW TROPHY

This trophy will be awarded annually to the top KUSA-registered Labrador Retriever breeding kennel at the LRKC Championship Show. To qualify, the kennel must be a paid up member of the LRKC, must have bred a KUSA Champion and must have bred the dogs under consideration for points allocations. All points are earned from KUSA Championship Shows only, excluding FCI Shows. Points are calculated per dog, per show. To qualify for Breed points, there must be a minimum of 3 (three) entries in the Group and to qualify for All Breeds Group points, there must be a minimum of 8 (eight) Labradors entered in total. If only a 1st place is awarded in the class for which points are being claimed, no points will be awarded, with the exception of Champions Classes as these exhibits are already proven.

Points are calculated cumulatively and are awarded as follows:

The trophy will be awarded at the LRKC Field Trial. To qualify, the dog(s) under consideration must have been bred by the kennel submitting the points. Championship Field Trial results do not count as this is a bi-annual event. Points are calculated cumulatively and awarded as follows:

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ADDENDUM 4

Proposed Amendment to the LRKC Constitution

At the KUSA Fedco meeting held on 6 December 2025 the following amendment to Schedule 03 – Regulations for Championship Shows, was approved.

Preamble

Current KUSA regulations provide for dispensation to be granted by the Executive Committee for a Championship Show to be held outside the Centre in which the Show-holding Club is domiciled. However, such a dispensation has either rarely, or never, been granted. This creates a practical limitation for Specialist Breed Clubs, where only one such Club for a particular Breed is affiliated to KUSA within Southern Africa. Exhibitors and enthusiasts of these Breeds are often spread across multiple Provinces and the restriction to the Club's domiciled Province limits accessibility and broader participation in such events. The Committees of such Clubs are often comprised of members from all over the country.

In view of the above, it was proposed (and accepted) that an amendment be made to Schedule 03 Regulation 2.1 to allow greater flexibility for standalone Specialist Breed Clubs. In cases where only one Specialist Club for a particular Breed is affiliated to KUSA, it was agreed that such Clubs be permitted to host their annual Championship Shows in Provinces other than the one in which they are domiciled. This would better facilitate participation by exhibitors of the said Breed residing in different Provinces and promote inclusivity and national Breed development.

Approved amendments to Schedule 03 Regulation 2.1:

Insertions in underlined bold type and deletions in ~~struck through square brackets~~.

2.1 Unless dispensation is granted by the Executive Committee, no Championship Show shall exceed two (2) days duration and no Championship Show shall be held outside the Centre in which the S[s]how-holding C[€]lub is domiciled.

2.1.1 Notwithstanding Regulation 2.1 above, if the Club is a standalone Specialist Breed Club (the sole Club for a particular breed affiliated to KUSA), it may apply 45 to the Executive Committee, as contemplated in Article 29.2, to hold its annual Championship Show in a Centre other than that in which it is domiciled, or to hold an additional Championship Show in such other Centre in the same year. In adjudicating either application, the Executive Committee shall take into account the geographical distribution of exhibitors, logistical factors and the overall benefit for the breed concerned, on the strict understanding that no licence shall be granted to a Specialist Breed Club to hold its Annual Championship Show in another Centre for two or more consecutive years.

Approved amendments to Club Constitutions of Standalone Championship Show-holding Clubs

As a consequence of the above proposal being approved by Fedco, the following proposal was also approved: Proposed addition to Standalone Championship Show-holding Specialist Club Constitutions:

Insertions in underlined bold type

3. HEADQUARTERS AND ADDRESS OF THE CLUB

The headquarters of the Club shall be as determined from time to time by the Committee, but shall be in the geographical area covered by [INITIALISM OF PROVINCIAL COUNCIL] and the Club's Dog Shows shall

take place within this area, or at any neutral venue as may be declared by KUSA from time to time.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Club is the sole Specialist Breed Club for [INSERT BREED (plural)] affiliated to KUSA, it may apply to the Executive Committee to hold its annual Championship Show in a geographical area covered by another Provincial Council, or to hold an additional Championship Dog Show in such other geographical area (refer to Article 29.2 of the KUSA Constitution). In adjudicating either application, the Executive Committee shall be obliged to apply the criteria contemplated in Schedule 03 Regulation 2.1.1.
