APPENDIX 1

DEFINITION OF BREED CLASSES AND ORDER OF BREED JUDGING

DEFINITION OF BREED CLASSES

It is compulsory for every Championship Show-holding Club holding Breed Classes to include the following Classes in the Show Schedule:

MINOR PUPPY (MP): For dogs of six (6) and under nine (9) months of age on the first day of

the Show.

PUPPY (PU): For dogs of nine (9) and under twelve (12) months of age on the first

day of the Show.

JUNIOR (JU): For dogs of twelve (12) and under eighteen (18) months of age on the

first day of the Show.

GRADUATE (GR): For dogs of eighteen (18) and under twenty-four (24) months of age on

the first day of the Show.

OPEN (OP): For dogs of any Breed therein provided for.

The following Classes are optional and the Show Schedule should reflect the Club's choice of additional Breed Classes and/or Challenge Classes as required.

CHAMPIONS (CH): For dogs awarded the title of Champion. If a dog is entered in this class only it may

not compete for the award of a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate.

MAIDEN (MA): For dogs that have not won a prize at any Championship Show.

NOVICE (NV): For dogs that have not won a first prize at any Championship Show.

LOCAL (LO): For dogs domiciled within a radius of 160 kilometres of the Show.

SOUTH AFRICAN BRED (SA): For dogs born in Southern Africa, south of the Limpopo River.

NAMIBIAN BRED (NA): For dogs born in Namibia.

VISITORS (VI): For dogs domiciled beyond a radius of 160 kilometres of the Show. MEMBERS (ME): For dogs where the exhibitor is a member of the Show-holding Club.

VETERANS (VE): For dogs of any age specified in the Show Schedule but not less than seven (7) years

of age on the first day of the Show.

BREEDERS (BR): For dogs where the exhibitor is the Breeder. The Breeder of any dog is the owner of

the dam at the time of whelping.

IMPORTED (IM): For dogs not born in Southern Africa and imported therein from any country outside

the jurisdiction of the Kennel Union of Southern Africa.

BRACE (BA): For two (2) exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one (1) Breed belonging to the same

exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in a Breed Class other than Brace or

l eam.

TEAM (TE): For three (3) or more exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one (1) Breed belonging to the

same exhibitor, each separate exhibit having been entered in a Breed Class other

than Brace or Team.

PROGENY (PR): Not less than three (3) dogs each to have been exhibited in a Breed Class, together

with Sire or Dam which need NOT have been exhibited in a BREED Class.

WORKING DOG CLASS (WD): For dogs with any of the following minimum qualifications:

Class "A" in Obedience, CD, FCI-IGP 1 in Working Trials, BWT or TT2/TT2.

NEUTER DOG (ND) For dogs of any age that have been castrated for any reason whatsoever (not eligible

for CC or BOB)

BABY PUPPY CLASS (BP) For dogs of four (4) and under six (6) months of age on the first day of the show (Not

eligible for CC or BOB. With separate classes for dogs and bitches)

For the purpose of this Appendix the term "Exhibitor" means the person who has, in terms of the Constitution, entered the dog for the competition.

The Champions Class is one in which the prize-winner shall be eligible for the award Best of Breed but shall not be eligible for the award of a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate unless such prize-winner is also a prize-winner of any other class.

A Restricted Class is a class for which the entry is restricted to dogs which have accumulated sufficient Challenge Certificate points towards the title of Breed Champion and such title has been awarded by the Kennel Union.

CHILDREN'S HANDLER CLASS (CHC):

(Schedule 05K)

For persons eight (8), but under twelve (12) years of age. When the person turns eleven (11), the person may elect to remain in the Child Handler Class until the day before they turn twelve (12) or elect to

move to the Junior Handler Class. Once moved, he may not return

to the Child Handler Class.

JUNIOR HANDLER CLASS (JHC):

(Schedule 05K)

For persons of eleven (11), but under eighteen (18) years of age.

ADULT HANDLER CLASS (AHC):

(Schedule 05K)

For persons over eighteen years of age.

When judging these Classes, the Judge shall only consider the ability of the handler to control, set up and gait the exhibit, together with the dress and ring demeanour of the handler. Only normal ring movements are allowed. The quality of the dog will NOT be taken into consideration by the judge.

ORDER OF BREED JUDGING

- 1. Breeds shall, by default, be judged in the order as listed in Schedule 02 Appendix "A1". In the case of:
 - 1.1. A full Group allocated to a single Judge, the breeds will be judged in the order they are listed in Schedule 02 Appendix "A1", unless varied by the Club with good cause and the revised judging order is published in the Official accepted Show Schedule;
 - 1.2. an alphabetically split part Group, e.g. A M and N Z, allocated to two different Judges, the breeds will be judged in the split order they are listed in Schedule 02 Appendix "A1", unless varied by the Club with good cause and the revised judging order is published in the Official accepted Show Schedule";
 - 1.3. a randomly split part Group, whether based on numerical strength, size, function or propensity, allocated to two or more different Judges, the order of judging shall be as published in the Show Schedule; and
- 2. Should the change in judging order in Regulations 1.1 and 1.2 above be necessitated or prompted by the accommodation of the judging order or starting times of Specialist Clubs or Group Clubs holding their Shows on the same day and at the same venue, the host Club shall ensure that all arrangements with Specialist Clubs or Group Clubs pertaining to the order of judging, starting times, and any foreseeable possible suspensions of judging due to clashes, are properly formalised in Letters of Agreement between the host Club and the Clubs holding their Shows in tandem with the Show of the host Club, which shall be submitted together with the draft Show Schedule to the KUSA office for audit and acceptance.
- 3. In breeds for which KUSA has adopted the FCI Breed Standard, in which more than one variety of the breed is identified for the awards of FCI-C.A.C. or FCI-C.A.C.I.B., such varieties will also be eligible for separate KUSA CCs. In the case of breeds for which KUSA has adopted the Breed Standards of The Royal Kennel Club (UK), KUSA CCs and FCI-C.A.C.s will be awarded separately to the varieties identified in the adopted KUSA Breed Standard but, at FCI International Shows, the varieties identified in the FCI Breed Standards of the same breeds will be eligible for separate FCI-C.A.C.I.B.s.
- 4. In any Group where certain breeds include two or more varieties, the order of judging of those varieties shall be as follows:
